Conditions Applying to Mooring Permits

Subject to approval of the mooring application, and in accordance with the *Lake Ordinance 1976* authority is given to moor the Boat as described on this Mooring Permit Application.

All Mooring Permits are subject to the following conditions:

PERMITS

1. Mooring permits are valid for a period no greater than 12 months.
2. Before 30 June each year, invitations to apply for mooring permits will be sent to those owners of mooring permits who have satisfactorily met the conditions of the mooring permit in the preceding 12 months.
3. New mooring permits will be considered at any time, and, if granted will expire the following 30 June.

MOORING FIXTURES

4. The buoy attached to the mooring will remain the property of the NCA. The NCA must be notified if the mooring buoy is damaged or missing.
5. The buoy attached to the mooring must be:
 - a. used solely as a marker for the anchor to which it is attached
 - b. spherically shaped and marked with the approved buoy number issued with the permit
 - c. attached to the anchor by materials of sufficient strength and in a manner which will minimise the risk of detachment from the anchor.
6. The anchor with the buoy chain and the line remains the property of the mooring owner and must be:
 - a. of sufficient strength and weight to hold the Boat and located so that when the Boat is moored, it will not interfere with, foul or damage any structure or other boat moored
 - b. secured correctly. The vessel is moored and fixed to the chain and not the mooring buoy (refer to mooring method)
 - c. inspected annually by an authorised mooring inspector, maintained to a standard which will serve its purpose, and any and all parts are replaced when required. All inspections, maintenance and replacements are at the mooring permit owners own cost.

MOORING OWNERSHIP

7. The mooring block, chain and fixtures are the property and responsibility of the mooring owner.
8. The mooring buoy remains the property of the NCA.
9. Mooring permits approved are not transferable from one person to another. A mooring cannot be traded, sold, transferred, rented, or relocated without the express permission of the Lake Delegate
10. Should a vessel with a current mooring permit be sold, the vessel must be removed from the Lake. If the new owner of the vessel wishes to moor on Lake Burley Griffin, a mooring permit application must be submitted to the NCA. No vessels are to be moored prior to the approval of any mooring application.
11. Should a mooring be no longer required, the owner is to have the mooring fixtures and buoy removed from the Lake and notify the NCA that the mooring is no longer required and has been removed.

LIABILITY

12. Owners of moorings are solely responsible for their moorings and vessels. The NCA does not assume any responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or theft in relation to the use of moorings, vessels on the moorings or any other items or possessions.

OTHER CONDITIONS

13. The permit holder agrees that:
 - a. the NCA will determine the location of the mooring
 - b. he/she will remove the anchor, buoy and vessel from the Lake when requested to do so by the NCA
 - c. when moored, the vessel will be connected to the anchored chain alone (not to the marker buoy)
 - d. adequate third party property insurance is maintained throughout the time the vessel is moored on the Lake
 - e. The vessel must be kept in good condition and:
 - i. Be clean and tidy at all times
 - ii. Display a current boat permit (if applicable)
 - iii. Free of excessive bird droppings, nests, and vermin
 - iv. All nets must be in good condition and not pose a hazard to birds
 - v. Well maintained (paint, finishes and veneers not to be cracked or peeling)
 - vi. Not to be used as a storage space for rubbish, or 'junk'
 - vii. Not be positioned in a place which creates an obstruction for other vessels or Lake users.
 - f. the mooring will be used exclusively for the vessel described for which the approval is given unless prior consent has been granted by the NCA
 - g. moorings shall not be vacant (i.e: the specified vessel not at the mooring) for a period longer than four months during the permit period
 - h. the Commonwealth is indemnified against any claim for damages or expenses through the placement of the anchor
 - i. Should mooring holders require the temporary use of another mooring, mooring holders are to contact the NCA to request the use of an emergency mooring.
14. The permit holder must notify the NCA if:
 - a. He or she changes any contact details such as address, phone or email address (including emergency contact details)
 - b. He or she does not require the mooring
 - c. Changes the vessel which is to be moored on the approved mooring.
15. The NCA may cancel any mooring permit at any time. If the NCA instructs any holder of a mooring permit to remove a moored vessel, he or she must do so within the period the NCA considers to be reasonable.
16. All vessels to be moored are also to comply with the requirements of boat permits as outlined in the Lake Burley Griffin Recreation Policy. Owners of vessels which require boat permits are to apply for, and maintain a valid boat permit for the entire time the vessel is moored in Lake Burley Griffin.

TERMS

Authorising Officer - means a person appointed by the Minister under section 6 of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*.

NCA - means the National Capital Authority

Lake - means Lake Burley Griffin

Permit - means this mooring permit issued by the National Capital Authority

Boat - means the vessel for which this mooring permit has been granted and as described on the attached application

Your attention is also drawn to the following provisions of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*:

SECTION 16: PROHIBITIONS RELATING TO BOATS ETC.

A person shall not place a boat in or take a boat from, or cause or permit a boat to be placed in or taken from, the Lake except within an Lake area specified in section 15 of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976* as a launching area; or moor a boat, or cause or permit a boat to be moored, on the Lake except within a Lake area specified under section 15 of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*, as a mooring area; or beach, clean or repair a boat, or cause or permit a boat to be beached, cleaned or repaired, within a Lake area except within an area specified under section 15 of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*, as a beaching area.

SECTION 25: MOORING OF BOATS

A person shall not moor a boat on the Lake unless the person is the holder of a permit issued under section 25 of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*.

SECTIONS 37-40: LIGHTING RULES

Where a boat is under way or anchored on the Lake between the hours of sunset and sunrise, the provisions of section 37 to 40 inclusive of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976* must be adhered to.

SECTIONS 41-47: RULES OF THE WATER

The navigation rules in sections 41-47 inclusive must be adhered to.

OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

A person who contrives or fails to comply with the provisions of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976* is liable to face penalties as provided by the appropriate sections of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*. Particular attention is also drawn to the sections 48 (navigating a boat in dangerous manner), 49 (careless navigation) and 50 (navigation of boats while under intoxication) of the *Lakes Ordinance 1976*.
