Celebrating the Magic of Marion in Canberra

THE Australian Government is pleased to announce a fantastic program of events by some of Australia's leading public institutions situated in Canberra celebrating the life and times of Marion Mahony Griffin.

Born in Chicago, Illinois on 14 February 1871, Marion was one of the first licensed female architects in the United States of America and the world. Not only did Marion produce some of the finest architectural drawings in Australia and America but was also instrumental in the award winning design plans with her husband Walter Burley Griffin for the design of Australia's Capital, Canberra.

Assistant Minister for Regional Development and Territories the Hon Nola Marino said "Bringing together key Cultural Institutions in the National Triangle and the Australian Institute of Architects ACT Chapter to celebrate Marion Mahony Griffin's 150th birthday is an exciting and informative initiative.
