Their vision was finally completed in the 1960s and the lake became an icon of mid-century engineering, which has set the backdrop for the development of key cultural institutions and government functions. Join the Australian Institute of Architects and Canberra Modern on a stroll around Lake Burley Griffin and the National Triangle while uncovering the history and development of mid-century Canberra, the Lake and the modernist buildings and infrastructure that surround it. What made Marion's Hair Stand on End?' An exploration of Marion Mahony Griffin's pioneering role as an environmentalist and urban planning

Dr Anne Watson has had a long association with the Griffins including as curator/editor of the 1998 Powerhouse Museum exhibition/catalogue Beyond Architecture: Marion Mahony and Walter Burley Griffin in America, Australia and India, editor of Visionaries in Suburbia: Griffin Houses in the Sydney Landscape (2015) and curator of Paradise on Earth (Museum of Sydney, November 2020-April 2021) celebrating the sesquicentenary of Marion's birth. She has also written and lectured extensively on the history of the Sydney Opera House including as author of 'The Poisoned Chalice: Peter Hall and the Sydney Opera House' (2017) based on her 2014 PhD thesis.
