



MAKE YOUR OWN

Milking Cow



Materials

- Cow template
- Coloured pencils
- Scissors
- Sticky tape
- Disposable rubber glove
- Water or milk
- A pin
- A bowl or bucket to collect the 'cow's milk'

Instructions

- 1 Ask a grown up to print and cut out the cow template for you. This can be found on our website: (<https://www.nca.gov.au/discover-and-learn/family-activities/little-griffins>)
- 2 Colour in the cow. Dairy cows (cows that make the milk we drink) can be black and white, but you can make your cow whatever colour you like.
- 3 Pour some milk or water into the rubber glove. Milk will be more realistic, but will make more of a mess if it gets spilt – so be careful!
- 4 Ask your grown up to tie a knot in the top of the glove and tape it to the cow's tummy.
- 5 Tape the cow somewhere you will have room to milk it, eg to the edge of a table so that the glove hangs down.
- 6 Put a bowl under the glove.
- 7 Ask your grown up to prick a little hole in each of the fingers.
- 8 Milk your cow by gently squeezing the fingers. Make sure you catch the milk or water in the bowl! Don't forget to upload some photos to social media and #NCEcraft



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
