

National Capital Plan Draft Amendment 94

National Arboretum Commercial Accommodation

Background

- 2003 ACT Government dedicates burnt-out pine forest as the site for a national arboretum
- 2004 national design competition announced (hotel included in competition brief)
- 2005 Taylor Cullity Lethlean Landscape Architects and Tonkin Zulaika Greer Architects announced winners
- 2006 initial master plan identifies a hotel, conference centre and car park on the southern side of Dairy Farmers Hill
- 2018 updated master plan continues to recognise site for a hotel
- November 2019 ACT Government's Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate formally requests a draft amendment to the National Capital Plan
- January 2020 NCA Board agrees to the request to prepare a draft amendment






What is proposed?

- Add the following uses as permitted within Hills, Ridges and Buffer Spaces:
 - 'Commercial Accommodation', not including caravan park, camping ground, etc (for Forests 69 and 76 at the arboretum only)
 - 'Personal Service Establishment', which allows for skin care, non-professional health and body care, etc (for Forest 76 only)
- Introduce detailed conditions of planning, design and development to guide the design and siting of accommodation and personal service ('wellness') facilities.

Key proposed provisions

- Maximum 40 accommodation units.
- Building height varies depending on location, but no more than two storeys/seven metres anywhere on the site.
- Buildings to be designed to be visually recessive and sit within the landscape. Visual analysis required to demonstrate impact.
- Development to achieve best practice in environmentally sustainable design.
- Architecture and design must exhibit biophilic design principles:
 - create connections to nature
 - allow natural processes, for example fluctuations in temperature and air flow, to mimic natural environment
 - use materials or landscape elements that reflect local ecology or geology.
- Landscape design to act as an extension of the existing planted forests.
- Car parking to be incorporated into landscape design for the site.


3D View - Site Aerial
